The McCarthy Era In New Hampshire, & Lessons for Today

On April 4th the World Fellowship Center, with the help of a generous grant from New Hampshire Humanities, will present evening panel discussions entitled:
“More Than Just Ourselves: Willard Uphaus, Louis Wyman, and Civil Liberties in the McCarthy Era.”

Michael Ferber, UNH Professor of English and Humanities, will lead a panel of distinguished scholars in a discussion of *Uphaus v. Wyman*, a 1950s legal case that was ultimately decided by the US Supreme Court. NH Attorney General Louis Wyman sought to prove that Willard Uphaus and the White Mountains conference center of which he was director (the World Fellowship Center) were guilty of subversive activities. Uphaus ended up going to jail for his principled refusal to turn over lists of guests, staff and speakers. At the upcoming events participants will consider questions that resonate today -- the balance between individual rights, liberties and conscience and the needs of the broader society.

In addition to Professor Ferber, panel members will be **W. Jeffrey Bolster**, UNH Professor of History, and **Clare Chapman**, Executive Director of the NH Council of Churches, and **Maria Sanders**, Associate Professor of Philosophy, Plymouth State University.
